Phill Moon commenced playing for the club in the 1971/72 season playing in the 2nd grade side. That year he also made a number of appearances in 1st grade. He also put up his hand to assist Col Berry with the preparation of wickets at Town Park.

Phill made a significant contribution to our Club in a number of roles during the period 1972 to 1992. Phil served as President of our Club from 1986-1992, a golden era for our 1st grade XI when 4 premierships were won.

Phill was a strong medium pace swing bowler and played in all grades for our Club. He took 219 wickets at the outstanding average of 11 with best bowling figures of 9 for 43 in 2nd grade on Brad Haddin Oval, and made 988 runs with a top score of 100. Phil captained the 2nd grade team with distinction for a number of years and has the club's 2nd grade bowling award named in his honour.

In the 1972/73 season, bowling his medium pace swingers, Phil figures read 189.5 overs, 24 Maidens, 65 wickets, 548 runs, an average of 8.43 (for the stats people, that is a strike rate of 17.52 and an economy rate of 2.89) with best bowling return of 9-43. He also took a hat-trick as well. His 65 wickets still stand as a club and association record for 2nd grade. Whilst his strength was his bowling, he was also a handy lower order batsman and has a ton to his credit.

Phil played 86 matches for the club in a career spanning across 17 years. He captained the 1976/77 2nd Grade Premiership team, after which he retired. His retirement didn't last that long, as he returned to captain our 5th grade team in the 1987/88 season.

Phil was actively involved behind the scenes, serving on the Management Committee for a number of years and was elected as President in 1986 and remained in the position until 1993,

when he stood down. However Phil served another 2 years as Vice-President. It was during this time that he formed a formidable club executive with Secretary Dick Carruthers and Treasurer John Solway. It was during this period that the club won four 1st grade premierships (as well as numerous other titles) in 6 years... a golden era for the club.

After retirement, Phill and Julie relocated to Cootamundra but he remained a keen supporter of our Club and regularly attended our Presentation night dinners. He attended his last Presentation night in March 2018 and those in attendance will remember him being interviewed by Mark Solway where he shared some of his fondest memories of our Club.

Phill was a truly wonderful person and a friend to all. He will be sadly missed.

President's Report

Season 2018/19 was another successful one for the Bluebags. Six Premierships we've secured – 2nd Grade won the One Dayers, 3rd Grade won both white ball competitions, and 4th Grade won all 3, whilst 1st & 5th Grades we're beaten One Day finalists. All in all this was a great season for the club proving we have the mix right in terms of talent and experience across the grades, a platform we can hopefully build on next season and beyond. Congratulations to all captains on leading our players through another great season.

I'll give a special mention to 4th Grade skipper Michael O'Rourke on leading his team to all three premierships. Chook is a big supporter of our clubs youth policy, and he did a great job in steering the side through the season. 4th Grade is a unique mix, you're either over 45 or under 15 – there's not many in between! But Chook did a great job and somehow got the mix right.

Big thanks as always to our coaching staff led by Head Coach Peter Solway. We made a few changes to our training structures this year, with a focus on quality over quantity. With the season we've had these changes can only be looked on as a success, and with a few more tweaks next season should show more improvement to our skills base across the board.

I feel like I write this every year, but I have to acknowledge that we continue to lead the ACT clubs in junior player development as we have done for the past 10 or more years. As shown in 3rd & 4th Grade our ability to develop our talented juniors, but also retain our senior experienced players to provide the vital guidance is unmatched. Our continued commitment to the development of juniors throughout the Queanbeyan and southern NSW area will ensure we remain the go to club for talented kids in the region.

Away from club cricket we again hosted various representative matches & carnivals, this season again saw us hosting the Comets in some preseason trials, the Defence Force & U/15 girl's nationals, as well as numerous junior comets matches. A massive thanks to everyone who volunteered their time in making these events possible, it's a huge logistical challenge running these carnivals but the benefits to the club make it well worth the effort.

As always, a big focus for the committee is continual improvement off the field – be that facilities, equipment, social events etc. This season was our first in the new sky blue kit, a great initiative which was well received by our members and it was done to allow us to establish our own identity – nearly half the Canberra clubs had royal blue so we needed the change!

We have secured financial grants from the Commonwealth Government to make improvements to our training nets at Neil Bulger Oval. The funding will allow us to extend the perimeter fencing and synthetic turf, improve the drainage and repair internal netting, ensuring a safer training environment for our players.

The council have also completed the new storage shed at Rockley Oval Googong, which will allow us to play more games through all lower grades in Googong this coming season.

Our local, state and federal politicians continue to be our biggest supporters, thanks as always to Queanbeyan Palerang Regional Council Mayor Mr Tim Overall, Deputy Premier of NSW Mr John Barilaro, and Member for Eden-Monaro Mr Mike Kelly. All 3 are passionate

advocates of the region and in particular continued investment in to improving sporting facilities, and we look forward to working closely with them to further improve our facilities.

Thanks to all of our sponsors for their ongoing support, in particular our major sponsor Ian McNamee & Partners, huge thanks to Macca and his board for committing to the next 3 seasons. Ian has been patron of our club for some 30odd years and there is not a more passionate supporter, and he is currently chairing a committee to secure funding for further improvements to the pavilion to ensure it remains the best facility in the region.

Secretary's Report

Whilst I have been compiling the rest of this Annual Report, I have been thinking about what should I including in my report without it being a clone of last year's report. Given that this is my 12th consecutive report, saying something new is always going to be tough.

One big item that was covered off last season was the bestowing of Life Membership upon Darren Southwell (pictured right with club President Rohan Ditton) as an acknowledgement of all the years of service to the club. Darren has been a great servant of the club and the honour is well deserved.



However as one more person is added to the distinguished list of Life Members, another was lost to us as just before the season had kicked off, when we received the sad news that Phil Moon passed away suddenly.

From an administrative perspective this has been another good year. A lot of work went into the various activities, including a new look playing strip, hosting of the various representative matches, including the annual Defence Force carnival and the U15s Women's nationals etc.

The club's annual golf day was another success, both from the enjoyment of the players involved (the weather was again kind to us) and in making a tidy profit. This is our major fundraiser each year and I would like to thank all those who volunteered their time to help out on the day.



In regards to our new clothing kit (mainly for the limited overs matches) the committee decided it was time to move away from what has been our traditional royal blue based strip and lean more towards a sky blue based strip.

As well as the new strip, we also introduced a new Club dress shirt design.

All in all both designs were well received.

This year the club also started on a path of building closer ties to the Junior club, with Adrian Bruncker taking on the role of Chairman of the Junior Committee and Michael O'Rourke taking on the role of Junior Pathway Manager/Youth Technical Director.

This season also saw Rockley Oval in Googong come online. Rockley is a great ground and has huge potential. Besides the club's home base, Rockley's pavilion is one of the best either side of the border. There is still work to be done but by the time this report has been published, the construction of a purpose built storage shed will have been completed, which should provide adequate storage for a field mower and pitch roller etc which will help in the preparation of the pitch.

In the past 12 months, the club was successful in obtaining two grants, one to go towards purchasing an electronic scoreboard and the other to provide subsidies to players to purchase cricket helmets. Also, just after the end of the season, the club was advised that we were successful in obtaining two other grants, one to towards the purchase of an AED and the other to undertake significant updates to our cricket nets and all being well the work should be done before pre-season training commences.

Of course there is no time to sit back on our laurels as there are still things to be done, especially in and around the pavilion. As the season wrapped up, thanks to one of our supporters Steve O'Neill, a permanent office and store room was built in 'downstairs'. Next thing on the bucket list is a proper trophy cabinet in the club room.

Also the committee is putting together a Freebody Precinct Improvement Project, probably only second to the Pavilion project of 7 seasons ago. The project will look at getting additional facilities to cater for womens cricket, stage 2 of our electronic scoreboard project and general upgrades to name but a few. Ian McNamee has kindly agreed to lead the project and with Ian's hand on the tiller we know that things will get done.

First Grade Report

(John Gallop Cup Runners Up)

The 2018/19 season saw another turn out of a young group in the first grade squad. To balance out the youth and provide some experience in the top order, Englishman Leigh Walker arrived in September as the clubs first overseas player in 4 years.

The change of scheduling for the season meant the first seven games would be in the 50 over format. We started the year with a tight victory over Ginninderra at Neil Bulger Oval. Quality displays from an old face in Mick Curtale making 40 no and young debutant Angus Jones showing plenty of promise, taking 2/26 off 7 and 20 no, helped to get us over the line.

After many strong bowling, yet shaky batting displays we finished the one-day competition with 4 wins, 2 losses and a draw. Four wins saw that we finished 4th on the Gallop Cup ladder, which meant we were to play minor premiers Tuggeranong Valley on the Australia Day long weekend in the semi-final.

After defeating Tuggeranong in the semi-final, we played against Weston Creek Molonglo in a day/night final at Philip Oval for the Gallop Cup. Weston Creek won the toss and elected to bat first. After claiming a couple of early wickets, we lost some momentum through the middle overs and Creek managed to put on 8/249 off their 50 overs. A fast start from Walker and Brad Falkenberg saw us 0/45 after 7 overs. Unfortunately that was as far as the run chase went after we were bowled out for 163 off 38 overs.

Prior to the Christmas break, we had the first two 2-Day matches of the Douglas Cup. The batting woes of the One-Day competition seemed to have been resolved when we took on Ginninderra with Walker making 59, M Solway with 61 and Dukoski hitting a magnificent 117 of 122 balls. Joys were short-lived however, with the eventual premiers chasing our total of 329 down with 5 wickets to spare.

The arrival of the T20 competition saw the return of Michael Spaseski and club legend Mark Higgs. Higgs showed his class when he blasted 105 off 69 balls in round 3 of the T20 competition against North Canberra. He then followed his batting display up taking 3/15 off his 4 overs to ensure the win.

Needing to win our last game and have other results go our way, a strong bowling performance headed by young leg spinner Jack Allen and Tyler Van Luin saw Tuggeranong bowled out for 103. A scratchy batting display trying to chase the runs quickly in order to gain a strong quotient led to us being 9-79 in reply. M Solway and Van Luin then put on 25, with Van Luin hitting a 6 off the second last ball to win the game. He then proceeded to tell most of the town after a few beers later that night. 3 wins, 3 losses and a washout meant we missed out on a finals spot due to a poor net run rate.

After seven rounds of the Douglas Cup we finished 5th with 1 outright win, 2 wins, a draw, and 3 losses, missing out on the finals by 4 points. The return of Dean Solway contributed to helping produce some competitive totals in the 2-day competition, where he accumulated 391 runs @ 55.86, which included 154 against Weston Creek. Other outstanding performances throughout the Douglas Cup went to; M Solway 5/55 off 17 in round 2, V Dukoski 154 runs in round 3, 5/42 in round 4 and 5/36 in round 7, T Van Luin taking his first 5 wicket haul for the club in round 5 followed by another 6/32 in round 7 and Stuart Bridgen making his first hundred for the club in round 5 also.

All in all, although results may not have gone our way, many positives were taken out of the season with a young group developing and showing some promise. We are all looking forward to next year.
