








# Vale – Neil 'The Legend' Bulger

31 March 1951 – 8 March 2022



Neil was a hard-hitting left-handed batter and left arm medium pace bowler, a mainstay of the Bluebags side in the 1980s and early 1990s. He was known at the club as simply "The Legend".

In 1972, he moved to the Canberra region to play rugby league, but he also played cricket for Queanbeyan, scoring two centuries and winning the ACT 1st Grade Player of the Year award.

Neil made his ACT debut in the same season appearing in two matches against the Australian Schools team and Queensland. Queensland captain Sam Trimble invited him to try out for the Queensland team, but he chose to stay in Tumut and play cricket and rugby league.

In 1974, he was selected to represent Southern New South Wales against the touring English at Manuka, but the match was cut short due to rain, and he only bowled four overs. He dominated the local Tumut competition, with his best season being 1977/78, when he scored 1013 runs at a whopping 202.60 average.

At the end of the 1978/79 season, he returned to Canberra to play before resuming his career at Queanbeyan. He scored 375 runs at 53.57, including 104 not out, and took 16 wickets the following season.

In 1980/81, he won the ACT 1st Grade Cricketer of the Year Award where he topped the first grade batting averages scoring 754 runs at an average of 68.55 as well as leading the bowling averages by taking 55 wickets at the low average of 8.11. He so dominated the season that he finished 5 points ahead of second place. In the ten rounds of voting he received 3 votes on eight occasions and 2 votes in the other two rounds. He also was awarded the NSW Country Cricketer of the Year for the season.

His efforts led Queanbeyan to their first 1st Grade premiership since 1958, taking 5 for 32 including the first hat trick in a first grade grand final.

In 1984, Bulger was announced as the 12th Man for the first Prime Minister's XI match of the modern era. Prime Minister Hawke at the time said that Bulger was selected as the 12th man for his services to cricket in the ACT, Bulger having announced his retirement from representative cricket at the end of the previous season with a final match against the New Zealand B side which was touring Australia at the time.

He was the ACT 1st Grade Player of the Year on three occasions, 1972/73, 1980/81 and 1981/82, the ACT Representative Player of the Year in 1980/81 and 1981/82, NSW Country Cricketer of the Year in 1980/81, the 1st Grade batting average in 1980/81 and 1982/83 and the 1st Grade bowling average in 1980/81 and 1981/82.

In 1988, an Australian Aboriginal side was selected to tour England, 120 years after the first Aboriginal side toured England. Neil had captained the NSW Aboriginal side in the Australian Carnival and was one of the first selected in the Australian side. He played for the Australian Aboriginal side against a Prime Minister's XI side at Manly Oval on two occasions, in 1987/88 prior to the side touring England and again in 1988/89 when he captained the side.

Bulger appeared in the ACT 27 times. He hit five fifties and scored 577 runs at 30.37. On the ACT tour of New Zealand in 1982/83, he took 47 wickets at 19.66, with a best of 5 for 36 against the New Zealand Under 22 XI. In total, he played 135 matches in 1st Grade, scoring 3933 runs at a strike rate of 37.10. He had ten centuries and 14 half centuries in an era when centuries were hard to come by. In 1st Grade, he took 253 wickets at an average of 16.14, with a best of 6 for 46 and 8 times taking 5 wickets in an innings.

After 20 years of representative retirement, Neil was talked into returning to the crease for the ACT Over 60s when ACT hosted the tournament in 2010. Two years later in Adelaide, Neil was instrumental in the ACT winning the Championship.

Neil continue to play in what has become Veterans Cricket Australia Nationals for the ACT until injuries cause his retirement in 2017. Sadly he was on the verge of another comeback to again play for the ACT in the Over 70s in 2021, but Covid caused the tournament to be postponed to 2022.

Neil Bulger Oval, Queanbeyan's second ground, was renamed Neil Bulger Oval in 2015. To commemorate the naming of the ground, Neil captained the Neil Bulger's XI against the Queanbeyan District Cricket Club President's XI, which was captained by former teammate Peter Solway. Neil scored 14 runs in his team's win over his former club.

He was a member of the Queanbeyan side for 25 seasons, scoring 7911 runs and taking 384 wickets while also being a part of five premierships. His brother Vince also played 1st Grade for Queanbeyan as did his nephew Ryan.

# Vale – Colvin 'Col' Berry

22 February 1939 – 5 June 2022

Col was originally from the Bathurst region and moved to Queanbeyan around 1959 and joined the club shortly thereafter. He initially played in the 3rd grade team, and made his 1st grade debut in 1959-60 season, playing 3 matches. By the time the 1960-61 season rolled around, Col was a regular in 2nd grade and played a big part in them winning the Premiership. From 1961-62 Col became a regular in 1st grade and played for a number of years before to moving down the grades to bring local juniors through.

In the lead up to the 1960-61 season, Col was instrumental in establishing the club's junior teams with the help of Col Holt, Les Manwaring and Alan Baxter.

Col showed his maturity when he was elected to the Management Committee at the 1959 AGM. After Col had served on the Club's Management Committee for a number of years and in 1964 put his hand up for the Secretary's job made vacant by the retirement of Frank Nash (who had served as Secretary/Treasurer for a record 17 years). In 1969 Col relocated to Goulburn/Southern Highlands due to work. He returned Queanbeyan in 1971 where he resumed playing for the club. He was approached to re-join the Committee and take on the role of Vice President. The following season with Ian Armour stepping down and retiring from cricket. Col was elected President and served 5 years.

All this time, Col continue to be a valuable club asset, with his left arm seamers and a capable lower order batter. He continued to play with the club, captaining 3rd grade for many seasons in the meanwhile mentoring youngsters such as Peter Solway and Michael Carruthers.

In honour of the contribution to the club, Col was bestowed with Life Membership in 1977.

Col finally put away the bat and hung up his whites at the end of the 1983-84 season having played for well over 20 years for the club.

Total club stats – 191 matches, 1653 @ 11.56 (HS 67), 71 wkts @ 15.46, Best 5/38 (unfortunately his lower grade stats from 1959 – 1963 are missing, a period when Col was at his peak)

Probably the main reason Col retired was that he bought the All Seasons Indoor Cricket Centre located in Aurora Ave Queanbeyan. Later on the centre moved to Cnr or Carrington & Hincksman Sts, almost fitting is that the business moved to a street named after a famous Queanbeyan cricketing family.

Then in 2006, Col was approached to captain the inaugural Veterans Cricket ACT (then called ACT Over 60s) team in a cricket tournament held here in Canberra. That tournament was the inaugural Over 60s National Championships. Col continued to play for the Vets for many years and his last appearance was in 2017 at Brad Haddin Oval. In 2021, Col was the first ACT Veterans player to be bestowed with Life Membership.

Some of Col's other achievements include

- Establishment of the Queanbeyan Kangaroos Club and serving as its first Secretary/Manager
- President of the ACTCA from 1975 1977
- Coaching ACT Women's Indoor Cricket Team to the National title in 1989
- Being recognised in 2015 by Cricket Australia for 50 years of service to the sport, and
- In 2019 being awarded Australian Community Cricket Champion.

Away from Cricket, Col was very active in the community, being a long standing member of Rotary Club of West Queanbeyan. He served as President and was a Paul Harris Fellow. He also travelled to Papua New Guinea in 1986 to help build school infrastructure for local communities.

Col was a wonderful family man and is loved and cherished by wife Ailsa, daughters Janelle, Helen and Christine, step sons, David and Keith and their partners. He also has a plethora of grandchildren with young Jackson Tarrant, son of Janelle, already a regular player with the Bluebags.

# **President's Report**

Season 2021/22 was a season of unprecedented challenges, extraordinary performances, the start of a new era and the end of another. With COVID challenges we managed to start about a month later than normal. And then it rained and rained and rained. In all, CACT reckon that 35% of all matches were washed out. In the VETs we only managed one match before Christmas and that was a rescheduled washout.

This season Queanbeyan restarted our connection with women's cricket after a hiatus of about 10 years. Cricket ACT restructured the women's competitions and we able to field a 2nd grade team and share a 1st grade team with Eastlake. We set out to make sure our women's team would feel welcome in the club and be treated as part of the club and I couldn't be prouder of how well it has gone. Great congratulations to David Horsfall and Sue Rebus who took on management of the team, the girls who committed to club training on Thursdays and our club coaches who helped build their skills. The season culminated with a semi-final berth the Lynn O'Meara (One day competition) and then two magnificent wins to take home the Glenda Hall Shield T20 competition. Well done ladies.

Once we got cricket underway Queanbeyan was very competitive across the grades, culminating in winning the club championship trophy by over 150 points. This is only the third time in the last 30 years we have won it!

In fact, we made finals in 14 out of 15 competitions, the Grand Final in 12 out of 15 and we were victorious in 8 out of 15. That's an outstanding result in anyone's language. For the first time in the club's history we hosted 4 semi-finals on our own grounds, and all as minor premiers in the second one-day competition. 5 out of 5 men's teams in the Grand Final is something that our club has never done before, and it been a long time since 1<sup>st</sup> Grade appeared in all 3 Grand Finals. They successfully defended their T20 title with dominant performance in the finals.

Conspicuous this season were the numbers at training, week in week out. I think COVID gave us all a new appreciation for being able get out and play cricket. Once again our outstanding coaching team of Peter Solway, Mark Higgs, Michael O'Rourke, Michael Stachow and Dave Horsfall set the standard. Their dedication, skill and commitment is clearly driving our playing performances in the right direction.

I would like to thank our sponsors - Campbell & George, ITSM Hub, Entire Physio, DJ Homes and BMF Plumbing plus the continuing of support from McNamee Real Estate and look forward to that continuing for many years. Campbell & George has proved a great venue to celebrate or commiserate after matches and they put on a wonderful presentation night for the club.

With all the weather challenges, this year was a difficult one for our curators. Ron Bates, Peter Solway and Dom Di Campli did an amazing job. Our facilities ratings were consistently above average. We are in the envied position of having 4 quality grounds but being able to use 4 grounds requires a lot more work from curators.

We invested heavily this year in new curating equipment which put a big dent in our bottom line, but is an investment in maintaining the quality of our wickets for the next 10-15 years.

We also started live streaming this season. I wasn't sure how it would go but thanks to the efforts of our 1st and 2nd graders we generally got the stream working. You can see video highlights from the season on our YouTube channel.

The new changerooms at Neil Bulger Oval commenced construction in May and should be completed in time for the start of the 2022/23 season. Ian McNamee and Michael Frost have been a great support in getting the project underway.

Both these men are tireless workers for the club even though they don't hold formal committee positions. Ian, especially, has been a great help to a rookie President and always promotes the club within the ACT and Queanbeyan communities. It was wonderful to be able to name our pavilion in honour of Ian.

In the same ceremony we honoured Peter Solway with the naming of our new scoreboard on Freebody Oval. It is fitting that the run machine will have his name on the scoreboard but of course it is also in honour of his many years of work off the field for the club.

I'd like to thank all members of the QDCC Committee who have worked so hard all year to help us perform on the field and keep the club running. Dom DiCampli took over as Treasurer and has managed the finances well, despite the challenges of the significant investments in equipment, and we look to have made a small profit for the season.

Finally, we lost a couple of club legends during the season. Firstly we were saddened of the sudden passing of Neil Bulger. He was an outstanding player, and many of his on-field records still stand today. In addition, everyone who knew Neil remembers him as a great bloke. The two do not usually go together. My favourite quote of those who spoke during our ceremonies across Canberra as we remembered him was "if you met Neil and you weren't his friend, you soon would be." All clubs, at all games in Canberra, observed a minute's silence in honour of Neil's contribution to Queanbeyan and ACT Cricket.

We then lost another Life Member, Col Berry. Col was one of the now rare breed of one-club players. Col began playing cricket for the club back in the 50s when there wasn't a junior competition. He began playing in what was sub-districts back then and became a very talented bowling all-rounder. He also was a very good administrator, serving as Secretary from 1965-69, then as President from 1972-76.

In between another Bluebagger, Steve 'Fossil' Donnelly passed away suddenly. While Steve only had a short playing career with the club, he was involved for many years with the Juniors, taking on roles of President and Coach.

Thank you for your trust in me as President. I believe we are in great shape and with a continued focus on quality facilities and coaching our juniors we are building the foundations for Queanbeyan District Cricket to thrive for many years.
